The Ageing Offshore Workforce?

Research Question:

Is there evidence that the proportion of older workers in the offshore workforce is increasing?

Principal Investigators:

Dr Allan Prentice (CNR and Capita)

Dr Graham Furnace (Maersk Oil and Oil & Gas UK)

Study Design:

Direct comparison of workforce age distribution on selected offshore installations, on two occasions ten years apart.
